Content

As mentioned in the final class, the exam will comprise the second half of the text, **primarily Ch 7-14 (with a handful of exceptions (ie. 10) thrown in for good measure)**. The definitions you focused on for the first test will not be found on this exam. The exam will instead focus on Canada and institutions of governance.

For the sake of simplicity and to enable online proctoring, I will make the full exam multiple choice and fill-in-the-blank questions. There will be 80 questions to answer over 90 minutes. That means you will have just over a minute for each question and this is intentional: it discourages you from searching the answer in another medium though you are able to reference your text and notes.
